Protagonist

- Main character
- Hero
- Can be evil!
- Examples: Harry Potter and The Grinch

Antagonist

- Opposes the main character
- Villain
- Can be good!
- Examples: Darth Vader and Javert from Le Misérables



Anti-Hero

- A protagonist
- Lacks conventional attributes of a traditional hero such as courage, morality, etc.
- Sometimes noble
- Don't always act for the right reasons
- Readers/Viewers root for this character
- Examples: Damon Salvatore from TVD, Walter White from Breaking Bad, Michael Scott from The Office, etc.

Anti-Villain

- An antagonist
- Have noble characteristics, values, and goals
- How they strive to achieve their goals is often questionable
- Backstories that give insight into their motives
- Readers/Viewers has sympathy for this character but still wants them to be defeated
- Examples: Thanos from MCU, Erik Killmonger from Black Panther, Magneto from X-Men, etc.
